You can support family literacy at home by providing time, space, and a range of literacy activities for your family to experience.

Need some ideas? Try one of these:

- Exchange books at a local book exchange library
- Join the **Genesee County Literacy Coalition**
- Play word-based board games
- Read, read, and read some more
- Read signs and logos aloud while riding in the car
- Share the love and joy of reading
- Talk about what you've read
- Visit the **Flint Public Library**
- Write a note or poem
